COVID-19 VACCINATION ORDER

On 25 October 2021, the COVID-19 Vaccination Order came into effect. This Vaccination Order makes COVID-19 vaccinations mandatory for anyone working onsite at a school who may come into contact with students. It applies to: all school staff (teachers, support and other onsite staff), contractors, volunteers, and anyone else engaged to provide onsite services. This order comes into effect on the 16th November. The main impact is that any parent wishing to attend a class camp (camp to Raukawa is not included) or trip will need to show proof of their vaccination status. Please keep in mind that the requirements for parents entering the school grounds to drop off their children or collect them have not changed. A reminder that these are to sign in using the QR code at the gate, to limit your time on site, and to observe social distancing rules. Thank you for your ongoing support.

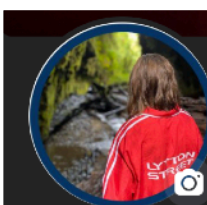
